The U.S. government has created a new organization to respond to the problem of “cybersecurity risks” posed by “foreign adversaries.” The National Security Council’s Cybersecurity Coordinator will have an enormous workload in dealing with that task. There is one big problem, though. The head of the new office, Rob Joyce, doesn’t have any cybersecurity experience. I’m not talking about cyber-security experience, but rather actual security

experience. Joyce's last job was as head of the National Institute of Standards and Technology, where he oversaw the development of the voluntary interoperability standards required for, among other things, digital rights management. This is where the real work of the problem of cybersecurity is done, and the national security of the U.S. is at stake. On November 3, 2013, the National Security Agency released what was, until now, its largest leak ever: 1.7 million documents taken from the NSA's internal systems. The documents detail the agency's practices and procedures for its intelligence collection activities. These leaks have already created a significant number of troubles for the Obama administration. They have led to congressional hearings, lawsuits, and investigations. But despite all of that, one thing that has emerged from all of this is the awkward relationship between the NSA and the private sector. What happened? Many American companies have continued to collaborate with the NSA even though they have become aware of all of this. For example, at this year's Black Hat hackers conference, researcher Jacob Nyvall gave a keynote talk that revealed how the NSA has been watching all of your online searches in real time. Even though that information is supposedly anonymous, he was able to gather more information than ever before about what people do online. Perhaps the most egregious example is how large tech companies continue to help the NSA.
